Walking our dog, we spotted this blossoming tree of a neighbor. Surely, Spring has come! es, he was sadly diagnosed with brain cancer. Some of you know this already, others with whom I'm not in email contact who receive this probably do not yet know. Gary McGeehon who has served locally on our Board of Directors for this ministry since 2014 (he served as Treasurer) was diagnosed with a very aggressive tumor. He was diagnosed before Christmas, but in a follow-up appointment MRI and other tests, it more recently was found to to be inoperable, aggressive, and terminal. He was given two weeks to two months to live, about two weeks ago.

Gary had already gone through radiation and chemotherapy

Phyllis had lunch with his wife today, and she says Gary has deteriorating cognitive abilities, but hasn't overall (with the exception of the cognitive) gotten physically worse so far.

However, earlier his body reacted rather negatively to the previous chemo with serious blood-clots, so more chemo isn't an option.

You can imagine the shock his family and friends felt when this came out of the "blue." Gary seems to be handling this remarkably well despite the frustration of losing his short-term memory and everything slowly becoming less convenient. His faith in the Lord is very solid and he is only thinking about how to get his wife prepared as best as he can before he passes.

I'm praying for a complete healing for him and continue to do so.

Thanks for your prayers for Gary and his wife Cathi! We are at that age where this is happening around us more than we like. Three neighbors on our street, including a next door neighbor, have passed away in the last few years and numbers of other friends, too. It's a reminder that unless the Lord returns, we all shall one day die, too. Fortunately, we have hope in the Lord beyond the grave.
