Other Updates:

- The Air Force Academy Christian Faculty Fellowship has already had two Christian faculty meetings this winter so far. A third was called off last Friday because of the death of a cadet at the Academy. He was killed in a one motorcycle accident when he went off the road and hit a guardrail. It was a shock to the Academy's leadership, faculty and cadets. Later in March, we'll get going again.
- The last two months since New Years have been challenging to say the least. The computer we use for our websites (including our main ACI ministry website) had its hard drive die and that put us in a tough place! The software we used was old—in fact, the company that makes the software went out of business in 2017—but the software was good and did work for us fine. The worst became apparent in that we lost data in the death of the hard drive and once replaced with a new one, the old software we rely on doesn't work correctly. That's not all. Since the death of our treasurer in July of 2022, we have been working to keep our accounting up-to-date. However, the accounting software has been complicated for us to work with and we spent months trying to learn its ways. We finally had to hire a professional to help us out. Looks like that's been worked out now.
- Last month, Phyllis had another dental surgery. It was the second dental surgery (three if you include the initial jaw fracture surgery repair). This time was to prepare her gums for braces. The surgery was successful and recovery took several weeks, but we think in a month or two she'll be ready for braces. It's hard to believe this all started on March 17th, nearly a year ago, when she stumbled and fractured her jaw in three places. **She's doing fine now**.
