## **Last Thursday a Grass Fire Came into Our City**



Perhaps you have heard about what is now called the **Marshall Fire in Colorado**. It took nearly 1,000 homes and structures in three cities and **we were one of those cities**. Our city of Louisville, CO lost over 500 homes.

We were evacuated from our home and fled to a Loveland motel, **but** came back the next day to find our home was still intact. Indeed, our whole neighborhood was fine. For a few days we were without heat, hot water, and drinking water; however, we always had electricity. Today we have heat and hot water, but the water is still not potable. Yet, we are doing

fine, because we have plenty of bottled water. This problem should be fixed in a few more days or weeks. They have to "flush" our town's water system to insure decontamination.

I sent many of you an email that described our experience in some detail, so I won't go over that any more. We are coming back into full action and are amazed how quickly we have gotten back to a new "normal."

I should say that Phyllis and I have not had the feeling of trauma that some have felt from this experience—from the closeness of the fire to our home and the possibility of losing our house. Some of our friends lost every earthly possession they had. Our son, Scott, does feel traumatized, but is getting over it slowly. That safe and secure feeling a home brings, he now realizes, can be taken away.

There is, however, a safer and more secure reality (not necessarily always a feeling) because we belong to the Lord and we are only sojourners for a while on this planet. We won't be able to take anything with us. Instead, we long for a new city with foundations whose architect and builder is God, where I would add, thieves do not break in and steal.
