He **has now moved home**. While he's earning his tenure status there I am sharing with him how to do conversational evangelism and how to build a Christian faculty ministry at the Queen's University in Belfast. Nice answer to prayer!

Another opportunity has opened up

former Christian professor who taught engineering at the Air Force Academy put a friend of his (another Air Force Academy graduate) in touch with me. This friend is working internationally with a group that is associated with the Navigator organization.

One of the places they work is in the mideast (please keep this confidential!) that are closed to missionaries and one of those nations they work in is Uzbekistan. Through their contacts there they have been working with an important "local" **who is building a new polytechnic university** in their capital for the government.

The good news is that the Air Force Academy graduate referral is asking our ministry to partner with this venture by allowing him to network with some of my key American Christian professors. Since my network is confidential I needed to vet him, their mission and their objectives; and I did that.

What they want to do is bring in Christian professors—some from my network—who are trained in ministry that can teach academic disciplines at this new school. It's a win-win situation where doors for the gospel through these Christian professors can be opened up, the professors will be paid for their work, and by their work they will help Uzbekistan's poly-tech school to build and to flourish.

I have already put him in touch with one of my key professors who is interested in this project and is very qualified for this task and through him they are networking to others. Would you please pray for the long term success of this project? Would you pray that the way we do this would honor the Lord and open many new doors for the gospel in that country? Thanks!
