In the Offing...

ou may have noticed on our first page the flyer for the upcoming Christian Faculty Fellowship meeting at the USAFA. We're having Dr. Russell Howell address our group about our faith and his discipline of mathematics. Perhaps you don't see why this is of any importance, but one of the important tasks besides saving souls is *saving minds*. I encourage and challenge our scholars to think Christianly about their academic work and Dr. Howell is one that already has. I'm hoping his presentation will inspire other scholars to take their Christian faith and God's word seriously in **all the disciplines**.

Why, because universities are seminal in the distribution of important ideas and it has become (and seems determined) to become even more secular in everything it addresses. This secularization trend plays out in what students are taught about religion, politics, economics, and the limits of science. From there, it trickles down into every important area of our culture. It is sadly ironic.

The early universities in America were started by Christians to educate the clergy and to educate the "knowing" class. One hundred and five of the first hundred and eight universities in America were founded by Christians, for instance, schools like Harvard, Yale, William and Mary to name only a few. However, over the last few centuries (especially the 19th—21st), they have become more and more secularized—not just in the way they conduct business, but also in the way they now understand the meaning of Reason and faith.

I want to be part of **resisting** that trend of secularism by turning it on its head and I want to **continue to train** Christian faculty in universities to do that.
